## TEACHING LEARNING SESSIONS

**Dr. Rabindranath Padhi**, Former PO, NSS, Nimapara Auto. College on Topic “Participation of Volunteers in Environmental and Disaster Management”. ### TEACHING LEARNING SESSIONS
